

Worship sheet Sunday 30th August 2020



There is an advert currently on the television about paint, but it starts with lots of promise statements including a doctor about to give an injection saying 'you won't feel a thing, I promise' and a child looking at a puppy saying 'I'll walk her every day, I promise'. All kinds of things we might say, but can't really promise to be true. This made me think about the promises of God, and the assurance we have that they are always true and can always be relied on.

The Bible is full of God's promises and reminders that he is faithful. Let's read a few as we come to worship

Psalm 145:9 The Lord is good to all; he has compassion on all he has made.

I Chronicles 16:34 Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; His love endures forever.

Psalm 100:5 For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

Then turn each sheet over and write things you want to bring to God that are big-picture such as complex global issues, and on the other, things that feel very detailed, or small, such as your own particular circumstances. God is interested in everything that concerns us. Bring all these before God, praising Him for the wonder of both the macro scale and intricate details of his handiwork and bringing your prayers of intercession for world issues as well as your personal situations knowing that as it says in 1 Peter 5:7 'You can throw the whole weight of your anxieties upon him, for you are his personal concern.'

We seem to have come into the autumn storms season very early this year and have already seen and felt the effects of two storms. We've seen pictures like this one reminding us of the strength of the winds and waves. We've seen pictures of people being caught in flash floods, which must be very

scary. I hope we don't have to experience such a thing physically, but we can feel as if we are caught in a storm emotionally or spiritually. In fact our Bible reading tells us that this will happen to us. It doesn't say **if** you go through the deep waters, it says **when** you go through the deep waters. I'm not very good at swimming, and I hate being out of my depth, I panic if I can't touch the bottom



of the pool. Fortunately, there are aides available and if I have a noodle around me that gives buoyancy I can feel confident in the deep end. God promises that when we go through the deep waters He will be with us. When we go through rivers of difficulty, we won't drown and when we walk through the fire of oppression we won't be burned.

This year, we would have to admit, has been the strangest. None of us would have imagined that it would turn out in this way when we welcomed in 2020. I'm sure at times we have felt as if we were going through deep water, out of our depth, not knowing how we would get through when we couldn't do what we would normally do, but we had a promise that God would be with us, and for sure, he has been and still is. That gives us the confidence to carry on. God makes numerous promises in the Bible, and they are there to be claimed. We have a God who is faithful, a heavenly father who will never go back on the promises he has made or withdraw them because we fail to measure up in any way.

As the song says

Since the Lord redeemed us from the power of sin
Since his Spirit sealed us other lives to win,
Grace enough is given that we may endure,
And we prove the promises of God are sure.



There is a wonderful promise at the beginning of our Bible passage. 'I have called you by name, you are mine.' What joy that brings to know that God knows us by name, he knew us before we were born and he is with us, by our side, every step of the way. He holds us in the palm of his hands, and there, we can feel safe and secure from the storms of life.

If you are able, listen to this song 'More than wonderful' which reminds us of the promises of God.
